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Supported Decision Making Virtual Book Study

Participants will learn how to apply and implement the principals of supported decision making with students with disabilities through the lens of the experience of Jenny Hatch and her pursuit for equity in her own decision making process in her adult life.

According to the author, Jonathan Martinis, this book is for “the people, parents, families, friends, professions, and practitioners on the front lines who give and get the support we all need to lead our best lives.”

Upon completion of the book study, participants will be given a template which will allow them to outline, document, and submit their plan for implementing practices and procedures discussed during the professional development.

This is a book study with 5, 2-hour zoom discussions. Participants will be given 4 additional contact hours for individual reading allowance. Completion and submission of this implementation plan is required to receive the 14 contact hours. Books will be provided to the first 20 participants.
